

The Tasmanian STEM Primary Teacher of the Year Award 2026

Guidelines and application form



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The awards

The Tasmanian STEM Primary Teacher of the Year Award 2026 (the Award) recognises the achievements of the state's leading Primary or Early Years teachers providing rich science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) learning programs for their students.

Supported by the Tasmanian Government, Inspiring Australia, and the University of Tasmania, the Award provides an opportunity to highlight the importance of exemplary STEM education for the growth of Tasmania's community and economy.

The Award consists of a \$5,000 cheque and trophy which will be presented at the Tasmanian STEM Excellence Awards reception on 10 November 2026. This event will showcase the winners' success to other educators, scientists, government, interested industry representatives, and the media.

Benefits to the winner and nominees

The benefits from participating in the Tasmanian STEM Excellence Awards are numerous.

The Awards provide:

- recognition and exposure for participating teachers and schools
- opportunities for networking and forming education and research alliances amongst participants, including other industry representatives, academics and teachers
- a 'showcase of success stories' for Tasmanian teachers and learners
- media exposure for exemplary Tasmanian STEM learning programs.

How to apply

To enter the Tasmanian STEM Primary Teacher of the Year Award, complete this application form and submit it to the Manager of Inspiring Australia Tasmania by:

6:00 pm Sunday, 27 September 2026.

Eligibility

Applications are invited from individuals undertaking primary and early years (Years Kindergarten - 6) teaching programs who are currently employed in Tasmanian Government and non-government schools and colleges. Teaching must be in the areas of science, technology, engineering or mathematics. Applicants must be registered with the Teachers Registration Board Tasmania. Previous winners of this category are not eligible to apply, but previous applicants are invited to re-apply.

Judging

The judging panel members will be selected on the basis of their knowledge and expertise in STEM primary education.

Selection criteria

The Awards will be presented to a STEM primary teacher who has shown innovation and consistency of best practice in STEM education in the classroom over the 2024-25 and 2025-26 financial years.

Achievements outside this timeframe will not be considered during assessment. In making their selection, the judging panel will consider the merit of innovation as well as achievements in engaging students in STEM, as highlighted in the questions asked in the application form below.

Other conditions

As a successful recipient of the Award, you may be invited to serve on the judging panel for that award category in the year following your attainment of the award. You may also be invited by the Tasmanian Government, Inspiring Australia, and the University of Tasmania to take part in a limited number of STEM engagement events, such as Science Meets Parliament, Innovation Forums, and student outreach programs if available.

Include details of the number of students/classes involved, and learning outcomes that relate to the Australian curriculum or Early Years Learning Framework.

Maximum 250 words. Additional content will not be considered.

8. Briefly outline how you develop student interest in STEM beyond the scheduled teaching program outlined in the curriculum.

Maximum 250 words. Additional content will not be considered.

9. Briefly outline how you demonstrate consistency of best practice in STEM education. For example, ongoing curriculum delivery, subject area leadership roles, professional learning and awards received.

Maximum 200 words. Additional content will not be considered.

If you wish to include some extra supporting material (such as student work examples or curriculum planning) please limit it to two appendices (two pages only per attachment).

2. Applicants will be competitively assessed on the basis of their application. The coordinators of the Awards or members of the judging panel may contact the applicants to seek further information and/or clarification.
3. Applicants must agree to abide by the decision of the judging panel.
4. All material submitted will be used solely for the purpose of applying for this Award and will not be circulated. No material relating to an Applicant's entry will be publicised without their prior approval.
